III. Update on COHSI 2007 Program Goals, Objectives and Strategies	Central Oklahoma Healthy Start Initiative (COHSI), Program Coordinator LaWanna Porter reported that 8 out of 11 of the 2007 Program Goals were met. No infant deaths reported. 60-75 mothers enrolled during 2007. 80 mothers currently enrolled in 2008. 2008 program goal to serve 299 clients has already been surpassed. The partnership agreement was distributed for review and feedback. Ms. Porter asked members to review partnership agreement with their program leadership and return a signed copy if possible to COHSI. IV. OKHMHB Strategic Planning Session Outcome June 2008	Oklahoma Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies Coalition (OKHMHB) State Coordinator, Bonnie Bellah reported on the June 11, 2008 OKHMHB statewide meeting and resulting strategic plan for July 2008- June 2009. Major goals are: a) Increase women's and their families' access to and utilization of a medical home b) Increase public and provider awareness of the impact women's health has on maternal and infant outcomes and c) Increase awareness and participation in OKHMHB Coalition. Review COPC Local Health System Action Plan 2005-2007 Priorities</p>	<p>Bonnie Bellah led group in continued revision of the COPC Local Health Systems Action Plan (LHSAP). Decisions included:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Change Objective 1 to focus on early entry into care with provider education on need to accept women before second trimester and education of public on need to enter early care 2. Keep Objective 2 and change to read as is Goal C in the HMHB 3. Hold Objective 3 as it needs to be more global an effort beyond the screening tool. This generated new discussion on implementation of the new law and what resources were available to providers to implement the law and support referral. Shelley Patterson reviewed the new law and will e-mail reference sources for distribution to members 4. Objective 4 was tabled – Resources not available to obtain the data required 5. Objective 5 deleted as the OU College of Nursing received grant to implement Centering Pregnancy at their sites 6. Objective 6 is to be incorporated under Goal B as written in the HMHB statewide plan 7. Objective 7 to be incorporated into Objective 2 and rewritten. <p>Members agreed to align COPC LHSAP goals with those at the statewide level by adopting the 3 goals set forth in the HMHB Plan which the members revised as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> A. Increase women’s and their families access to and utilization of a medical home B. Increase public and provider awareness of the impact women’s health has on maternal and infant outcomes C. Increase awareness and participation in the OKHMHB and the COPC <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 8. There was agreement to adopt the statewide outcomes listed in the HMHB plan 9. There was agreement to work on local priorities and measurable objectives to address the goals and outcomes during the September 2008 COPC meeting 10. Bonnie asked all members to go back to respective agencies, organizations and identify what they will do to support accomplishing the goals and outcomes and be prepared to address at the September meeting which will be facilitated by Ms. Glenda Russell, MHR. 11. Revisiting target population and service area was identified as a need in order to help focus COPC efforts in accomplishing its plan. 12. Future educational sessions will incorporate ideas generated during the strategic plan such as invitations to Insure Oklahoma - OHCA; Think, Prevent, Live – Child Death Review Board; and the Oklahoma Department of Insurance –CHAT program. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Future COPC Education Session should include presentation by the Child Death Review Board member on the campaign resulting from their findings. Lisa Funderberg with Oklahoma Community Health Services agreed to submit article for the Spotlight on Member column of the next COPC Newsletter and Bonnie Bellah will write article. Katherine Gayman, Healthy Start Consumer, announced that the Community Awareness Day held June 20th at the OKC Zoo was a huge success with 641 participants. Janis Williams thanked COPC members for their support. Shelley Patterson, Oklahoma Health Care Authority reported 2,675 Soon To Be Sooners enrolled in coverage. LaWanna Porter reported COHSI awarded a two year Postponing Sexual Intercourse (PSI) Grant. Jill Botkins, OSDH announced Oklahoma site visit to Arkansas Angels Program to consider applicability to Oklahoma's efforts to improve perinatal health outcomes. Debbie Rice, OUHSC announced meetings in progress to consider combining High Risk OB Clinic within the Dept of OB-GYN to help streamline services and access to care.</p>
